Summer Semester Schedule

May 31 - August 27

Doctrine of God: May 31 – June 4 (1 sem. hr.) **Dr. Louis Hill**, President, Reformed Discipleship Ministries; Adjunct Professor of Spiritual Life and Theology, New Geneva Theological Seminary; D. Min., M.A.T.S., Reformed Theo. Sem.; M.Ed., Auburn Univ., B.A., Samford University. Conference Speaker, director of Navigator’s small town and rural network.

An examination of theology proper, God’s nature, existence, attributes, decrees, creation and providence will be presented.

Old Testament Theology: June 7 - 18 (2 sem. hrs.) **Dr. Daniel K. Chinn**, Associate Professor of Biblical and Theological Studies, College of the Ozarks; D. Min., Covenant Theological Seminary; M. Div., Westminster Theological Seminary; B.A., Oklahoma Wesleyan University; Church Planter.

This is a progressive study of theology as it is presented in the Old Testament with a focus on God’s Covenants.

Doctrine of Inspiration: June 21 - 25 (1 sem. hr.) **Rev. Randy C. Martin**, Instructor, Veritas Scholars Academy; Former Pastor, Covenant Presbyterian Church, (PCA)Bakersfield, CA; Biblical Studies Department Chair, Instructor in Ethics, Bakersfield Christian High School; M. Div., Covenant Theological Seminary; B.A. UCLA; Apologist and Writer.

This is an exposition of the doctrine of the Scriptures with special attention given to divine inspiration and Biblical inerrancy.

Doctrine of Man: June 28 – July 2 (1 sem. hr.) **Rev. Randy C. Martin**, See credentials above.

This is a systematic study of man’s origin as a covenant creature and covenant breaker, his need of salvation, his redemptive state and future glorification.

Missions: July 5 - 9 (1 sem. hr.); **Rev. Benjamin T. Parmer**, Associate Pastor, Brookdale Presbyterian Church, St. Joseph, MO; Director of Operations, International Xchange Org.; M.Div., Sangre de Cristo Seminary; B.S. Business Management, Samford University; former Dean of Students, Sangre de Cristo Seminary, Missionary to Puerto Rico and Asia; Campus Outreach Ministry, Univ. of Central Florida.

This course will consider the purpose, philosophy, methods and history of Christian missions.

Church History: July 12 - July 23 (2 sem. hrs.) **Dr. Tony Felich**, Senior Pastor, Redeemer Presbyterian Church (PCA), Overland Park, KS; D. Min. Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary; D. Arts, Whitefield Theological Seminary; Th.M., Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary; M. Div. Covenant Theological Seminary; B.A., Moody Bible Institute; Soccer Coach and Hunter.

In this course the history of the church will be studied from New Testament times to the Sixth Century.

Pastoral Counseling: July 26 – Aug 6 (2 sem. hrs.) **Chaplain (COL) Ret. James Griffith**, PCA Teaching Elder, M.Div. Pittsburgh Theological Seminary; B.S., Purdue University ; CPE Advanced Status; Served as the Senior Chaplain at Landstuhl Regional Medical Center, Germany for six years during the height of hostilities during the Afghan and Iraqi wars; Pastor.

This is an introduction to providing pastoral counseling in light of Biblical principles.

Comparative Biblical Theologies: Aug 9 - 13 (1 sem. hr.) **Dr. Dominic A. Aquilla**, President and Professor of Pastoral Ministry, New Geneva Theological Seminary; D. Min., Westminster Theological Seminary; M.Div., Reformed Theological Seminary; B.A., Belhaven College. A prominent leader in the PCA; Pastor.

This course will compare the differences between various contemporary Biblical issues such as theonomy, dispensationalism, covenantalism, views of creation and the charismatic movement.

New Testament Introduction: August 16 - 27 (2 sem. hrs.) **Dr. Dwight F. Zeller**, Director Emeritus, Sangre de Cristo Seminary; D. Min., Eastern Baptist Theological Seminary; Th. M. Chicago Graduate School of Theology; M. Div., Memphis Theological Seminary; B. A., Bob Jones University. Pastor and Navy Chaplain (CDR) Ret.

This course considers the background and setting of the New Testament along with its transmission, manuscripts, canonicity and translation.

Ephesians: June 1 – Aug 24 (1 sem. hr.) **Rev. Ryan K. Reynolds**, Dean of Students, Sangre de Cristo Seminary; D.Min. Candidate, Covenant Theological Seminary; Diploma in Biblical Studies, Sangre de Cristo Seminary; former Pastor, Redeemer Christian Fellowship, Roswell, N.M. *This is a weekly exegetical study of Paul's Epistle to the Galatians with application for today.*

Public Worship: June 2 - August 25 (1 sem. hr.) **Dr. Andrew S. Zeller**, President, Sangre de Cristo Seminary; D. Min., Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary; Th.M. Covenant Theological Seminary; M.Div., Sangre de Cristo Seminary; B.A. Covenant College; CPE Advanced Status; Pastor, Army Reserve Chaplain (COL) Ret.

This is a time of sincere worship followed by a discussion. The students are exposed to different models of worship practiced by the instructors.

Fall Semester Schedule

September 6 - December 10

Essentials of New Testament Greek: (10 sem. hrs.) **Rev. Ryan K. Reynolds**, See credentials above. *Students will learn the basics of New Testament Greek grammar and syntax and begin to translate and study the New Testament from the Greek.*

Pentateuch and Historical Books Survey: (2 sem. hrs.) **Dr. Andrew S. Zeller**, See credentials above. *This course will cover the background, development and purpose of the Books from Genesis through II Samuel.*

Hermeneutics: (2 sem. hrs.) **Dr. Andrew S. Zeller**, See credentials above.

This course explores the principles of Biblical interpretation and how these principles are used.

Teaching, Preaching, Worship Seminar: (2 sem. hrs.) **Rev. Ryan K. Reynolds**, See credentials above.

Students will be supervised and evaluated in teaching Bible lessons, leading worship and preaching.

Greek Exegesis and Greek Seminar: (2 sem. hrs. each) Prerequisite: N.T. Greek. **Dr. D. James Johnson**, Superintendent, Evangelical Christian Academy; D. Min., New Geneva Theological Seminary; M. Div., Sangre de Cristo Seminary; M.B.A., University of Phoenix; B.S., University of Florida; Ruling Elder, Village Seven Presbyterian Church; Executive Director, Horn Creek; Pastor.

Detailed studies of New Testament passages will be made from the Greek Text. Seniors will prepare and teach sections of New Testament passages and will give written and oral exegetical reports.

Hebrew Exegesis and Hebrew Seminar: (2 sem. hrs. each) Prerequisite: O.T. Hebrew. **Dr. Dwight F. Zeller**. See credentials above.

Detailed studies of Old Testament passages will be made from the Hebrew Text. Seniors will prepare and teach sections of Old Testament passages and will give written and oral exegetical reports.
