Doctrine of the Holy Spirit: June 6 - 10 (1sem. hr.)

Rev. Luke Evans: Lead Pastor, Christ Church San Antonio, TX; M.Div. Westminster Theological Seminary; B.A., Baylor University.

A systematic study of the Biblical teaching on the Holy Spirit, His work and place in the Trinity.



<u>Biblical Geography and Archeology</u>: June 13 - 24 (2 sem. hrs.)

Dr. David W. Chapman: Professor of New Testament and Archaeology, Covenant Theological Seminary; Ph.D., Cambridge (England); M.Div. and M.A., Trinity Evangelical Divinity School; B.A., Rice University.

These courses show how a geographical understanding of the Bible lands and archeological discovery sheds light on Biblical interpretation.

New Testament Theology: June 27 – July 8 (2 sem. hrs.)

The students will study theology as it is presented progressively in the New Testament.



Church History II: July 11 - 22 (2 sem. hrs.)

The history of the church will be studied from the Sixth Century through the Protestant Reformation

A survey of the structure and message of the OT. Poetic literature will be given.

A systematic theology of the person and work of Jesus the Christ, Son of God, and Redeemer.



<u>Church Leadership</u>: August 15 – 19 (1 sem. hr.)

Rev. Philip S. Kruis: Pastor, Rincon Mountain Presbyterian Church, Tucson, AZ; Board Member, Providence College; M.Div. and Masters in Marriage and Family Therapy, Reformed Theological Seminary; B.A., Dordt College.

The spiritual dimension of church leadership, as exercised by elders, will be emphasized.



Church Evangelism: August 22 - 26 (1 sem. hr.)

Students will study the Biblical teaching on evangelism and various methods used today.



Eschatology: August 29 – September 2 (1 sem. hr.)

Four predominant evangelical views concerning Christ's second coming will be evaluated Biblically.

This is a weekly exegetical study of Malachi with application for today.

Public Worship: June 1 - August 31 (1 sem. hr.)

This is a time of sincere worship followed by a discussion. The students are exposed to different models of worship practiced by the instructors.

Essentials of Biblical Hebrew: (10 sem. hrs.)

Dr. Andrew S. Zeller: see credentials above.

Students will learn the basics of Biblical Hebrew grammar and syntax and begin to translate and study the Old Testament from Hebrew.



Old Testament Survey II - Prophets and Writings: (2 sem. hrs.)

Dr. D. This survey course will cover the background, purpose, and content of the books of I Kings - Malachi.

Homiletics: (2 sem. hrs.)

Dr. Andrew S. Zeller: see credentials above.

This course explores the principles of expository preaching.

Teaching, Preaching, Worship Seminar: (2 sem. hrs.) Facilitated by the Core Faculty.

Students will be supervised and evaluated in teaching Bible lessons, leading worship, and preaching.

Greek Exegesis and Greek Seminar: (2 sem. hrs. each); Prerequisite: N.T. Greek;

Detailed studies of New Testament passages will be made from the Greek text.

In the Seminar course seniors will prepare and teach sections of New Testament passages and will present oral reports.

Hebrew Exegesis and Hebrew Seminar: (2 sem. hrs. each); Prerequisite: O. T. Hebrew;

Detailed studies of Old Testament passages will be made from the Hebrew text.
