June 1 – August 28



Church Music PT541: June 1 - 5 (1 sem. hr.) **Rev. Jeff Pate**, Pastor, Riverwood Presbyterian Church, Tuscaloosa, AL; M. Div. Sangre de Cristo Seminary; B.Ed. in Choral Music, Auburn University; Church Music Director; also served as Director of the Wet Mountain Valley Chorale. *A Biblical and historical study of music, and the pastor's responsibility for music in the worship ministry of the church.*



Doctrine of the Church ST453: June 8 - 12 (1 sem. hr.) **Rev. Luke Evans**, Executive Director, Reach South Texas, San Antonio, TX; M.Div., Westminster Theological Seminary; B.A., Baylor University; also served as Founding and Senior Pastor at Christ Church San Antonio. *This course in ecclesiology is a systematic study of the Biblical teachings concerning the Church.*

Doctrine of the Sacraments ST452: June 15 - 19 (1 sem. hr.) **Rev. Luke Evans**, See credentials above. *The Biblical and historical teaching of the meaning, means, and recipients of the sacraments will be studied.*



Apologetics ST611: June 22 – July 3 (2 sem. hrs.) **Rev. Matthew Holst**, Rhetoric School Principal, Evangel Christian Academy; M.Div., New Geneva Theological Seminary; M.A. in Historical Theology, Westminster Seminary, California; also served as Pastor, Classical Christian Teacher. *Students will be introduced to various world views and the discipline of defending the Christian Faith through Scripture.*



Church History III HT732: July 6 - 17 (2 sem. hrs.) **Dr. Anthony J. Felich**, Pastor, Redeemer PCA; D.Min., Th.M., Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary; D.Arts, Whitefield Theological Seminary; M.Div., Covenant Theological Seminary; B.A., Moody Bible Institute. School Pastor for Heritage Christian Academy, Chairman of Candidates and Credentials Committee of the Heartland Presbytery (PCA), and Board Member for Sangre De Cristo Seminary. *The history of the church will be studied from the Protestant Reformation to the Modern Church.*



The Pastor's Walk PT882: July 20 - 24 (1sem. hr.) **Rev. Benjamin T. Parmer**, Co-Vocational Minister, International Xchange Org.; M.Div., Sangre de Cristo Seminary; B.S., Business Management, Samford University; also served as Pastor, Dean of Students, and Missionary. *The Pastor's union to Jesus Christ, Glorifying in His Cross, Fellowship with His Church and walking in the Spirit are foundational aspects of ministry. Without a focus on these principles a seminary education may be counterproductive.*



Pastoral Duties II PT842: July 27 - 31 (1 sem. hr.) **Dr. Philip S. Kruis**, Pastor, Rincon Mountain Presbyterian Church, Tucson, AZ; Board Member, Sangre de Cristo Seminary; D.Min., Covenant Theological Seminary; M.Div. and Masters in Marriage and Family Therapy, Reformed Theological Seminary; B.A., Dordt College. *The pastoral administrative responsibilities common to pastors in overseeing the office and business aspects of the local church will be introduced.*



Pastoral Duties I PT841: August 3 - 7 (1 sem. hr.) **Rev. Nathan Currey**, Associate Pastor, Redeemer Presbyterian Church, Overland Park, KS; M.Div., Covenant Theological Seminary; B.A., Moody Bible Institute; Fellow with the Association of Certified Biblical Counselors. *The pastoral responsibilities such as weddings, funerals, and visitation, will be studied and practiced.*

Doctrine of Salvation ST441: August 10 – 14 (1 sem. hr.) **Dr. Anthony J. Felich**, See credentials above.

Students will study Soteriology to deepen their understanding of the finished and ongoing work of Christ.



Biblical Ethics ST471: August 17 - 28 (2 sem. hrs.) **Rev. Randy C. Martin**, Executive Director, Ambassador Presbyterian Church (ARP), Apex, NC; M.Div., Covenant Theological Seminary; B.A. UCLA; Former Pastor, Covenant Presbyterian Church, (PCA) Bakersfield, CA; also served as an Apologist, Writer, and Christian High School Instructor.

A study of the Biblical standards for personal, ecclesiastical, and social norms of behavior.



Epistle to the Colossians BT381: June 6 - August 29 (1 sem. hr.) **Mr. Jesse Smith**, Ministry Director/Core Faculty Member, Sangre de Cristo Seminary, M.Div., Sangre de Cristo Seminary; B.A., St. Olaf College; also served as Pastor, and Special Education Teacher.

This is a weekly exegetical study of Colossians with a focus on the epistle's purpose and development with application for today.



Public Worship PT811: June 3 – August 26 (1 sem. hr.) **Dr. D. James Johnson**, President, Sangre de Cristo Seminary; D.Min., New Geneva Theological Seminary; M.Div., Sangre de Cristo Seminary; M.B.A., University of Phoenix; B.S., University of Florida; Ruling Elder Emeritus, PCA; also served as Pastor, Christian Camp Director, and Christian School/Seminary Administrator.

This course exposes the student to different models of worship practiced by the summer instructors.

Fall Semester Schedule - 2026

September 7 – December 11

Essentials of Old Testament Hebrew ET112: (10 sem. hrs.) **Mr. Jesse Smith**, See credentials above.

Students will learn the basics of Old Testament Hebrew grammar and syntax and begin to translate and study the Old Testament from the Hebrew.

New Testament Survey BT331: (2 sem. hrs.) **Dr. D. James Johnson**, See credentials above.

In this course students will read the whole New Testament and will cover the background, themes, development, and purposes of each book.



Applied Exegesis ET640: (2 sem. hrs.) **Dr. Andrew S. Zeller**, Core Faculty Member and Former President, Sangre de Cristo Seminary; D.Min., Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary; Th.M. Covenant Theological Seminary; M.Div., Sangre de Cristo Seminary; B.A. Covenant College; also served as Pastor and Army Reserve Chaplain (COL) Ret.

This course trains the students to follow a logical process in preparing sermons and Bible lessons. This was formerly called The Exegetical, Hermeneutical, Homiletical Process.

Greek Exegesis and Seminar ET232: (2 sem. hrs. each) Prerequisite: N.T. Greek; **Dr. D. James Johnson**, See credentials above.

Detailed studies of New Testament passages will be made from New Testament Greek texts. In the Seminar, Seniors will prepare and teach sections of New Testament passages and oral reports.

Hebrew Exegesis and Seminar ET132: (2 sem. hrs. each) Prerequisite: O.T. Hebrew; **Dr. Andrew S. Zeller**, See credentials above.

Detailed studies of Old Testament passages will be made from Old Testament Hebrew texts. In this Seminar, Seniors will prepare and teach sections of Old Testament passages and will present oral reports.

Teaching, Preaching, Worship Seminar PT812 (PT822/PT832): (2 sem. hrs.) **Dr. Andrew S. Zeller**, See credentials above. *Students will be supervised and evaluated in their teaching Bible lessons, leading worship and preaching.*
